#### Planned support in 2015-16

1. Enhanced Schools Programme from NSSP. Professional development opportunities for teachers in PE and sport, young leader training, extended opportunities for competition at inter and intra school level. £2,750
2. Two specialist teachers delivering PE YR- Y6. £3,000
3. Sports Equipment. £1,250
4. Minibus contribution £3,000

#### Planned impact of Sports Premium in 2015-16

1. Teaching of REAL PE by all staff at least good on observation Summer 2016.
2. Specialist teachers delivering PE YR- Y6- good or better on observation.
3. Engagement with extended schools programme from NSSP- NQT support, wider opportunities for vulnerable groups, gifted and talented pupils and links with sport coaches and clubs.
4. 30 young leaders from Y5 trained and leading lunchtime and inter school competitions in every year group.
5. Increase/ maintain equipment across school. To include more variety for inclusion- boccia, curling and archery.
6. Sustainable commitment to attendance at sports fixtures without relying on parents, few staff members.
7. Working towards Gold Sportsmark.

2. Sports Equipment. £1,000

#### Planned impact of Sports Premium in 2016-2017

1. Teaching of high quality REAL PE is now accessed by all year groups.
2. Intra-school competitions take place regularly in every year group.
3. Introduction of lunchtime sporting activities so that all children engage in recreational sport during the school day.
4. Increase/maintain equipment across school. To include more variety for inclusion - boccia, sitting volleyball, curling and archery.
5. Sustainable commitment to attendance at sports fixtures with increased attendance of a wider group of children and a higher number of disadvantaged children to attend.
