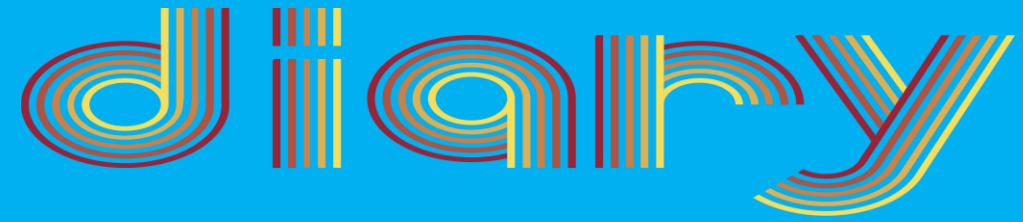

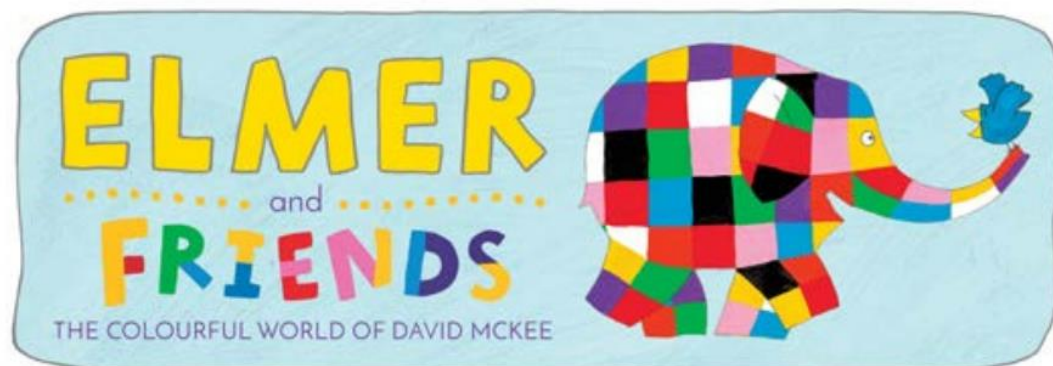

Online Safety- Age Ratings

Check age ratings!

There is so much that we can do online nowadays including playing games, chatting with others, watching TV or sharing our videos/photographs. Being online can be great but it is important that we set boundaries for our children to keep them safe whilst they explore being online, develop their digital resilience and understanding of what to do if anything negative happens when online.



So how can we help keep our children safe? We can start by checking age restrictions/ratings. **It is important that we follow these to ensure that what our children are doing or seeing online is appropriate for their age.**

Online Safety- Age Ratings

Where can I find age ratings?

Films: The British Board of Film Classification (BBFC) rate films. This page includes a link to a 'Parents' Guide to Age Ratings':

<https://www.cbbfc.co.uk/resources/viewing-films-safely-online>.

Video games: PEGI provides age classifications for video games. PEGI considers the age suitability of a game, not the level of difficulty. It is important to note that PEGI do not take into consideration user generated content within games (such as on Roblox) and chat facilities within games.

Apps: Check the individual age ratings within the relevant app store. We also recommend that you download any apps and play them yourself to check their suitability.

Social Media: All social media networks have a minimum age rating; they are all at least 13+.

Online Safety- Age Ratings

Understanding Age Ratings - Own It - BBC

What else can I do?

- Explain the importance of age ratings to your child.
- Go online together to see what your child is accessing.
- Set up parental controls on your broadband, devices and on any individual apps that your child is using. This will reduce the chances of them accessing or viewing anything unsuitable.
- Chat to your child regularly about what they are doing online and as always, remind your child that if anything is worrying them then they should talk to you or another trusted adult.

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Rhino Rewild

Forty rare southern white rhinos have moved to their new home at the Muniwana Conservancy in Zululand, KwaZulu-Natal, South Africa. They are the first of 2,000 privately owned white rhinos to be relocated under African Parks' massive 'Rhino Rewild' programme. African Parks is a non-profit conservation organisation that manages twenty-two national parks across twelve countries. It purchased the rhinos last year with the aim to 'rescue and rewild' them over the next ten years. Thokozani Mlambo, Chairperson of the Makhasa Trust (part of the Muniwana Conservancy) said, 'We are extremely pleased to receive

these forty rhino from African Parks, to supplement the current population of white rhino at our community conservancy. We see this as recognition of the important role that community-owned land plays in conservation, and we are proud to be collaborating in such a significant partnership to rewild rhino across our continent.' Southern white rhinos were thought to be extinct, until less than a hundred were discovered in South Africa in 1895!

Rethinking Recycling

Recycling Minister, Robbie Moore, has announced that a new, easier approach to recycling will be introduced in England. The new rules, brought in by the government, mean that households will be able to put all their recycling together for one collection. Ministers hope that this simpler idea will help boost recycling levels across the country. Recycling collectors will accept plastic, metal, glass, paper and card in one bin. English councils will also be able to take food and garden waste at the same time. Robbie Moore said, 'We all want to do our bit to increase recycling and reduce the amount of waste sent to landfill – but a patchwork of different bin collections across England means it can be hard to know what your council will accept. Our plans for Simpler Recycling will end that confusion: ensuring that the same set of
